EASTER SUNDAY

FOCUS: We demonstrate our belief in the empty tomb by the way we live our faith.

Peter and the beloved disciple rush to the tomb and believe. We rush toward many things in our busy lives - does our rushing around include paying attention to how God is working in our lives, and

speaking to us? We show we believe the tomb is empty by the way we live our faith.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Peter speaks to his listeners about what has happened all over Judea - the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Paul tells the Colossians they have been raised with Jesus and therefore need to seek what is above. In the Gospel, Mary of Magdala brings the news of the empty tomb to Simon Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved. Peter and the beloved disciple rush to the tomb.

Please accept my gratitude for all you offered to the parish in support over all these years. I find that I am writing today, because we have been asked how people can continue to give regular donations to the church with all the Masses suspended, and as of this writing, no end in sight.

We have several parishioners who 1) have planned with their banks for the banks bill paying service whereby a check is sent to the parish thru the post office mail. The check arrives with the parishioner ID in the memo section and is sent according to the schedule you set up with your bank. The other method is 2) they mail the check to us on whatever time schedule suits their budget needs. If the memo line includes your parishioner ID, we can assuredly provide credit to your registration should you wish a tax statement at the end of the year. If none of the above works for you feel free to do whatever you can.

We understand that charity begins at home and familial responsibilities must take priority. However, with no end to the crisis in sight I find at this time that I need to appeal to all of you, especially those who have not been impacted financially by this crisis, to continue supporting the Church not only with your prayers but your financial assistance. The church relies on your regular donations and weekend collections to continue its operations.
