THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

FOCUS: If we do not speak and act for Christ, who will?

Saint Teresa of Avila once wrote that Christ has no body on earth but ours. This 16th Century mystic understood what Jesus meant when he said, *If you love me, you will keep my commandments.* She believed we meet Jesus' expectation by becoming a voice for the voiceless, as Philip did in Samaria - where his preaching, signs, and deeds brought great joy.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Philip proclaims the Gospel in Samaria and many people are cured. Peter and John follow and lay hands on the newly baptized there, *and they received the Holy Spirit.* In the second reading, Peter encourages the community to always be ready to give reason for their hope and be willing *to suffer for doing good.* In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that those who love him will follow his commandments.
