TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FOCUS: God knows even the hairs on our heads - we need not be afraid of anything.

Jesus exhorts: *Do not be afraid. Do not be afraid. Twelve to *not be afraid,* even under persecution, trusting their Father who counts even the hairs on their heads.
